

# Canada Repair Strategy

The service strategy for the Apple Studio Display is wholeunit replacement in Canada. To prevent "no fault found" returns on the unit, Apple Canada implements the following procedure when an Apple Authorized Service Provider requires service support:

1 The service provider calls Escalation Support Austin (ESA) for technical support at 1-800-217-9517, option #1, #3.

**Important:** Service providers, have your 10-digit service account number (beginning with 61) ready.

- 2 The ESA phone agent works with the service provider to troubleshoot the unit over the phone.
  - If the ESA phone agent determines the issue to be related to setup or software, he/she will advise.






• If the ESA phone agent determines the issue to be hardware related, he/she will transfer the service provider to Service Provider Support Administration (SPS) along with a case ID number.







The neck of the desktop stand can be raised or lowered for optimum viewing height. The back of the desktop stand includes a cable guide for easily routing cables.









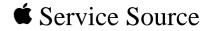



# Symptom Charts

#### No Raster

- No raster (screen is black); green power indicator light on
- Verify computer signal by connecting a known-good monitor. Then disconnect the known-good monitor and reconnect the Apple Studio Display. Ensure the monitor's video cable and ADB cable are connected to the computer.
- 2 Adjust front panel brightness (it may be set too low).
- 3 If screen brightness has decreased over time, the most likely condition is the backlights failing. The backlights have an average life of 10,000 hours (about 40 hours per week for five years. If the display is over a year old and you suspect backlight failure, contact an Authorized Apple Dealer for replacing the backlights.
- 4 US only: Call Apple Technical Support at 1-800-919-2775.





White screen at power on; random/ predominant screen color; controls on bottom of display do not respond

- 1 With system power off, disconnect ADB cable from computer. Disconnect power to the display. Reconnect power to the display, and reconnect ADB cable to the computer.





**Caution:** Before handling the Apple Studio Display, ensure that you have a clean, flat work surface. Protect the display face from scratches or nicks by placing a protective film over it. Remove all jewelry that could scratch or damage the display or plastic housing.







#### Desktop Stand

**Caution:** Before you begin, ensure that you have a clean, flat surface to work on. Protect the display face from scratches or nicks by placing a protective film over it.







- 1 Adjust the neck of the desktop stand to its highest extended position.
- 2 Remove the cables from the cable guide on the desktop stand.








- 3 Tilt the display so the bottom of the rear housing touches the desktop stand.
- 4 Open the cable door.







- 5 Remove the ADB cable from its port in the rear housing.
- 6 Remove the ADB cable from the cable clamp.







7 Using a flat-blade screwdriver, loosen but do not remove the two thumbscrews and thin plastic washers at the rear of the display.

**Note:** Keep the thumbscrews and washers attached to the desktop stand.







- 8 While supporting the display, tilt up the bottom of the display, and raise it off the three metal tabs on the stand.
- 9 Place the display on a clean, flat surface.








#### Flip-Out Stand

**Caution:** Before you begin, ensure that you have a clean, flat surface to work on. Protect the display face from scratches or nicks by placing a protective film over it.









- 1 Support the display at the carrying handle.
- 2 Using a flat-blade screwdriver, loosen but do not remove the two thumbscrews and thin plastic washers at the rear of the display.

**Note:** Keep the thumbscrews and washers attached to the flip-out stand.








- 3 While supporting the display, tilt the flip-out stand down and away from the display to release the three tabs from the rear housing.
- 4 Place the display on a clean, flat surface.








#### Audio/Video Door

Before you begin, position the display with the A/V door facing you.

1 Open the A/V door.








2 Pull the A/V door away from the rear housing.






**Replacement Note:** Align the two hinges on the A/V door to the two small openings on the rear housing. Press the A/V door into place.

# Quick Reference for Setting Up and Adjusting the Apple Studio Display

These instructions are for quickly setting up the Apple Studio Display and adjusting settings for the best screen image.


**Important:** For detailed instructions, refer to the Apple Studio Display User's Manual.

- 1 Plug in the display.
- 2 Connect the display cable to your computer.

**Important:** The ADB connector on the display cable is not optional. If the ADB connector is not connected, the maximum number of resolutions and software controls will not be available.







- 3 For a Mac OS-based computer, connect the keyboard and mouse to the desktop stand.
- 4 Start up the computer. (You might see an image on the screen; this is a normal characteristic of a flat panel display.)
- 5 Insert the Apple Displays Software CD into the CD-ROM drive on the computer, and install the Apple Displays Software. Restart the computer.
- 6 Open the Apple ( ) menu, choose Control Panels, then choose Monitors & Sound.

**Note:** If you're using a Windows-based computer, use the On Screen Display to make adjustments. For more information, refer to chapter 3 in the Apple Studio Display User's Manual.





- 7 Make adjustments so the screen image is crisp and clear.
  - a Set the resolution to 1024x768, which provides the sharpest image for optimal performance. Click the Monitor button at the top of the Monitors & Sound control panel. Then select a 1024x768 resolution setting in the Resolution area.
  - Make sure the sharpness is set to the maximum level. Click the Flat Panel button at the top of the Monitors & Sound control panel. Then move the Sharpness slider all the way to the right.
  - c Adjust tracking to synchronize the video signal, so the screen image is not blurry or fuzzy. Click the Tracking button. In the window that appears, click + and to change the Coarse and Fine adjustments. Adjust the controls to eliminate or minimize any horizontal and vertical lines or "noise" you see on the screen. The screen image may get slightly worse






before it sharpens. When finished, click OK.

- d Click the buttons in the Position area to center the screen image.
- e Make sure the black level and white level are set correctly. Click the Optimize button in the White Level & Black Level area to automatically adjust these levels to the optimal setting. (You can adjust the black level and white level separately; however, click Optimize to make sure these are always at the optimal settings.)
- f Adjust the brightness. Click the Monitor button at the top of the Monitors & Sound control panel. Then move the Brightness slider to the desired setting.
